#### **ABOUT** WIT & WISDOM

*Wit & Wisdom*<sup>®</sup> is a Kindergarten through Grade 8 English language arts (ELA) curriculum created by Great Minds<sup>®</sup>, a nonprofit that brings together teachers and experts who believe all students deserve access to rich, rigorous content. Wit & Wisdom integrates ELA strands so that students read to learn; the curriculum does not systematically teach the youngest students to learn to read. For structured foundational skills instruction, Wit & Wisdom teacher-writers recommend that early elementary educators use Wit & Wisdom alongside a proven, research-based foundational skills program.
