Students will read and write for a variety of purposes including, but not limited to, academic and personal, for extended periods of time.

# Reading

Students will read independently for a variety of purposes and for extended periods of time. Students will select appropriate texts for specific purposes.

## 5.8.R

Students will select appropriate texts for specific purposes and read independently for extended periods of time. In each module, Appendix D provides a list of texts for independent reading. These texts are grade-level appropriate and related to the module topic.

# Writing

Students will write independently for extended periods of time. Students will vary their modes of expression to suit audience and task.

#### 5.8.W

Students will write independently over extended periods of time (e.g., time for research, reflection, and revision) and for shorter timeframes (e.g., a single sitting or a day or two) to communicate with different audiences for a variety of purposes.

Supplemental material is necessary to address writing independently over extended periods. Students write over extended periods in each *Wit & Wisdom* module in the context of whole class instruction. The following lessons illustrate how *Wit & Wisdom* Grade 5 has students write independently for shorter time frames.
